ATTENDANCE BINDERS

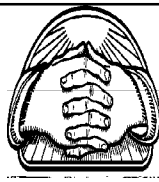

Chapter Member of the Week:

Introducing Julie Helgaas

I am Julie Schauer Helgaas, a life-long Episcopalian who usually attends the eight o'clock Sunday morning service. As a child I became familiar with the 1928 Book of Common Prayer as it was the form used during services. In order to follow the order of the service (this was before the printing of lengthy bulletins) the congregation used the Prayer Book, turning from page to page, back and forth, and occasionally getting lost. When this happened I would listen for the priest to give instructions or turn to the people near me and say, "I am lost, where should I be?" They would direct and help me to find my place. The childhood feeling of being guided and directed by the Church was a lesson that has served me well and I carry it with me today. When I feel lost, misdirected or in need of help I know where to turn, to the priest, to the people sitting in church with me, or to the Book of Common Prayer and I know I am not alone.

I am a newcomer to Gethsemane having moved here a year and a half ago from Jamestown. I was a member of Grace Episcopal Church (40 years) and over the years joyfully served in many roles. I am a retired high school/college educator. My first husband Jim Schauer died of Leukemia and I became a single, working mother to three very young children. When the children were grown and into college I married Maynard Helgaas, a widower from Jamestown. My daughter Sarah Jarrell lives in California with her husband Brad and their sons Cooper and Spencer. My two sons, Jim and Tom Schauer live in Fargo. Tom is married to Summer (Schwan) and Jim is engaged to Amanda Nelson. Their wedding will be in September here at the Cathedral. My favorite activities are: cooking for my family, knitting, (I teach classes at Prairie Yarns), gardening (I am a Master Gardener) and substitute teaching in the West Fargo school district.

I look forward to serving as a member of Chapter, and encourage you to visit with me, as I wish to know all of you better. Oh and just in case you didn't hear the joy and pride in my voice, I will repeat, I am an Episcopalian!
